Summary Report of 74th Independence Day Celebrations

Independence Day, in India, national holiday celebrated annually on August 15. Independence Day marks the end of British rule in 1947 and the establishment of a free and independent Indian nation. It also marks the anniversary of the partition of the subcontinent into two countries, India and Pakistan, which occurred at midnight on August 14–15, 1947. (In Pakistan, Independence Day is celebrated on August 14.) Independence Day is celebrated on Saturday, August 15, 2020 in India.

British rule in India began in 1757 when, following the British victory at the Battle of Plassey, the English East India Company began exercising control over the country. The East India Company ruled India for 100 years, until it was replaced by direct British rule (often referred to as the British raj) in the wake of the Indian Mutiny in 1857–58. The Indian independence movement began during World War I and was led by Mohandas K. Gandhi, who advocated for a peaceful and nonviolent end to British rule.

Independence Day is marked throughout India with flag-raising ceremonies, drills, and the singing of the Indian national anthem. Additionally, various cultural programs are made available in the state capitals. After the prime minister participates in the flag-raising ceremony at the Red Fort historic monument in Old Delhi, a parade ensues with members of the armed forces and police. The prime minister then delivers a televised address to the country, recounting the major accomplishments of India during the previous year and outlining future challenges and goals. Kite flying has also become an Independence Day tradition, with kites of various sizes, shapes, and colors filling the sky. Also, to commemorate the day, government offices in New Delhi remain lit throughout the holiday, even though they are closed.

Independence Day is celebrated through festivities across India. Notably, the prime minister visits the Red Fort monument for a flag-raising ceremony and delivers a televised address that is broadcast nationwide. Other traditional events include flying kites and wearing the tricolor.

India's path to independence from British rule was spearheaded by the work of Mahatma Gandhi, who organized and led a series of nonviolent protests. Other important figures include Mohammed Ali Jinnah, the leader of the All India Muslim League and Pakistan's founder, and Jawaharlal Nehru, a follower of Gandhi and India's first prime minister.

Principal along with Heads of all department, teaching and non-teaching staff participated in the celebrations of Independence Day Celebration and made it success. The celebrations were started by flag hoisting and followed by National Anthem. After National Anthem, the celebrations move ahead by speeches by principal and Senior faculties. All speakers mentioned about the measures that should be taken against COVID-19 in this pandemic situation. The independence was celebrated carefully by maintaining physical distance and following the rules and regulations given by the state government. The Independence day celebrations were organized by Student Welfare Department Head Mrs.Udayasri and the coordinators. The Student Welfare Department is very thankful to the Management of KGR CET, Principal, Heads of all departments and to all teaching and non-teaching staff for making the Independence day celebrations a grand success.
